The exhibition catalogue features an interview with Max Yela, a devoted supporter and historian of artists' books and Head of Special Collections at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Accompanying the exhibition is a small historical display of artists' books, as well as a selection of books made for the Veterans Book Project, a publishing project coordinated by artist Monica Haller who works collaboratively with veterans to create powerful books about their experiences in Iraq and Afghanistan.

A big thank you to the 82 artists who submitted 138 books to the exhibition, and a special thank you to everyone who donated their books to the new Cofrin Library Artists' Book Collection — what a great way to kick off this artists' book initiative.

Please find enclosed the exhibition catalogue with its interview with Max Yela, the irrepressible special collections librarian and advocate for artists' books at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. For all of you who live close by Max will be giving a public lecture "Reading the Books (and not just its contents): The ABCs of Artists' Books" on Wednesday, October 24th at 4pm in the Lawton Gallery. This talk is free and open to the public.

The Exhibition Checklist includes all the works submitted to the exhibition, but as you will see from the show documentation there were some works displayed in vitrines that were not included in this checklist. Two vitrines display Edward Ruscha works and three samples of contemporary homages/pastiches, and the third vitrine has the artists' books that Max Yela talks about in his interview, these artists are: Jessica Poor, Mark Wagner, Jody Williams, Pati Scobey and Karen Kunc. My thanks to the UW-Milwaukee Special Collections for facilitating this loan.

The exhibition also included books from two very generous loans to the collection from James R. Hugunin and Lise Melhorn-Boe. On one pedestal in the show are books about artists' books for visitors to learn more about the history of artists' books. Another table also features 30 books published by Monica Haller through her Veterans Book Project, an ongoing project in which she collaborates with veterans from the Iraq and Afghan wars to create books about their experiences using their photos, diaries and writings. I want to thank the Cofrin Library and the UW-GB Vets for Vets Student Group for facilitating the purchase of these powerful books.
